WOW Information

Women On Water (WOW) is a recognised Emsworth Slipper Sailing Club activity that welcomes members of other sailing clubs to join in with a planned programme and includes Patrol Boat cover manned by volunteers. Individuals join activities at their own risk.

Booking a Club Boat: All participants must advise Mary Alston in advance of each session (by phone or email) if use of a club boat is required, please advise which type of boat (e.g. Sport 16 / Wayfarer / Feva / Topper etc.) Resources will be allocated on a first come first served basis.

Insurance: It is the responsibility of all participants using their own boats to have Third Party liability insurance and to display current Conservancy Harbour dues.

Registration: Participants in programmed events are required to sign on and sign off at the ESSC WOW registration desk or with the Patrol Boat crew who has been detailed to maintain the register sheet for that event.

Individual participants are responsible for the sea-worthiness of their own boat.

Individual participants are responsible for ensuring they wear the appropriate kit, including life jacket.

Club Boats: Members using club boats are expected to return, wash and stow everything correctly and to report any defects, in accordance with club rules governing use of club equipment.

Patrol Boat cover: In the event that Patrol Boat cover is not available, the event ceases to become a programmed club event. Individuals can sail but at their own risk.

The organiser will set a finish time after which Patrol Boat cover is withdrawn, at which time the event ceases to be a club event. If using a club boat, the participant must return at the designated time.

Club Sport 16s: are used provided they have an individual deemed as competent on board. They may remain on the water after the withdrawal of patrol cover only if they have a radio on board and the individuals understand they are there at their own risk.

Locking up: The last person on club premises is responsible for switching out lights and locking gates. For security reasons, the door to the changing room must NOT be propped open.

First Aid: It is the individual's responsibility to advise the organiser of any medical conditions in advance.
